Also, we plan to sing a couple of our songs in church the following Sunday, July 25. VBS is for kids ages 4 through 5th grade. Middle and high school youth are needed to be Egyptian family leaders.

Last Day of Sunday School, June 6.

This is the last day of Sunday school for this school year. Everyone will start in their classes at 9:00 and have a chance to say farewell to classmates and teachers. At 9:30, we will all make our way out back to the grassy field for an Egyptian treasure hunt and refreshments.

New acolyte training, June 13. Any student who will be entering 4th grade or above in the fall, is invited to train as an acolyte to serve All Saints'. We will hold training after the 8:00 service (approximately 9:00am) on this Sunday, upstairs in the sanctuary. If you are interested in becoming an acolyte, please attend: you can see what is involved before you commit to the coming year. New acolytes will be added to the summer schedule. All acolytes are requested to attend and help train the new people, and to refresh your own training (it's also a good time to see if you need a new robe—you've grown!).

Scholarships for Camp Cross. We want everyone to be able to enjoy all that our diocesan camp has to offer. Any student attending Camp Cross for the first time is eligible for a full scholarship from All Saints' First Timer Fund. Returning campers can apply for a full or partial scholarship from the Robison Fund. Contact Joan Yetter or Theresa Grate for more information. Children's Chapel continues through the summer. Offered during the 10:15 service, kids ages 3 and up are welcome to join us downstairs. We gather in the preschool classroom, then process to the children's chapel area, where we have a lesson/story and prayer time, then some play time before joining our families upstairs during the Peace to participate in Communion. Children's Chapel will continue through the summer, including when we go to one service at 9:00, and visiting family members are welcome to join us any Sunday—just sign them in in the room.

Nursery news. Jennifer, our nursery attendant, will be out for the month of June with her new baby (due any day, now!). During June, we will have some volunteer attendants. Jennifer plans to be back in July.

VBS Prep Days, June 15, 16, 17. Help us get ready for Vacation Bible School by making decorations, making costumes, and prepping crafts. We will be working from 9:30 to 2:00 each day. All Saints' Cookbook

We are now collecting recipes for the All Saints' cookbook! There are two ways to submit your recipes. The quickest and easiest way is on your computer, online. Simply go to www.tyopensave.com. Click on the "login" tab, which will take you to the login page. Type in the contributor's name (that would be you if it's your recipe contribution), the group login, which is "allsaints," and the password, which is "trinity." Click on the submit tab, and you will be logged in. You can then click on "add recipe" either at the bottom or left hand side of the page and the form for typing in your recipe will come up. Filling in the form is easy. Below the recipe instructions is a place to add any Recipe Notes, if you have any, such as "This recipe has been in our family for three generations." Once you're done, you can double check what the recipe will look like on the page by clicking on "preview." Please check carefully for any errors, make corrections by clicking on "edit," then click on "save" when everything is correct. You can then add additional recipes or log off when you're finished. Members of the Cookbook Committee will proof your recipe(s) before final submission, but please save us time by checking each of your submissions carefully for accuracy before saving it.



If you don't have access to a computer or are having difficulty with submitting your recipe online, you can also submit handwritten recipes. Forms are located in the Narthex, Parish Hall, and office. Just fill out the form, following the directions printed on the back, and return it to the church. Collection boxes are located in the Narthex and office reception area. Please use the form provided and print clearly so the cookbook committee can input your recipes correctly.
